Players now can enjoy a Par 71 course that was totally renovated in 2022-2024. The well-maintained wide fairways and challenging white "Augusta" sand bunkers invite many pleasure-filled rounds of golf.

In addition, Audubon International in 2023 certified the course as a wildlife sanctuary. Its many sprawling areas of pristine nature and wildlife havens benefit our animal friends as well as all Leisure World residents.

This calendar's design provides easy access to basic information about golf course fees and regulations plus a calendar of organized golf events as were known at the time of printing. At all other times, the course is available for open play.

Tee times must be reserved through the Pro Shop by phoning (301-598-1570). No walk-up tee times will be available. Be aware that events may be added to the schedule, and weather may impact play availability.

The Maryland Interclub Senior Golf Association (MISGA) schedule is provisional. The final schedule was not available at the time of printing.

NOTE 1: A Club Membership consists of paying the Annual Tournament Fee for one of the following: Men's League, Ladies 18-hole League, or Ladies 9-hole League along with paying the Annual USGA Handicap and Golf Club Operation Fee. Lady golfers may not belong to the Ladies 9-hole League and the Ladies 18-hole League concurrently. The additional Golf Club Operation fee in 2025 will enable

the Golf Club to actively encourage new Club Membership and golf participation for Leisure World residents. Club Membership entitles members to establish a handicap. These fees are not refundable.

NOTE 2: To play in Men's/Ladies 18-hole tournaments and events, payment of the Annual Greens Fee is required in addition to the fees mentioned in Note 1. This fee is not refundable.

NOTE 3: To play in Ladies 9-hole tournaments and events, Club Membership is required (see **NOTE 1**). These fees are not refundable. Annual Greens Fees are not required, but Ladies 9-hole players not having paid Annual Greens Fees must pay the Daily Greens Fee per the schedule when they play.

Trial Membership Program

- Residents who have never paid the Resident Greens Fee may play for a 3-month period for a fee of \$250. Players using this program may also pay the appropriate Golf Club Fees and are then eligible to play in Golf Club tournaments and events while their trial membership is active.
- Associates are not eligible to participate in the Trial Membership Program.
- If the Resident would like to continue under the Annual program at the end of the 3-month trial period option, they may do so by paying a fee equal to the number of months left in the year times \$87.50. This must be paid in full at the end of the Trial Period.
- At the expiration of the 3-month Trial Period, if the remaining balance is not paid, the Resident starts paying Daily Fees to play.

NOTE 4: This program option is available for one time only. Fees paid for this program are not refundable.

Golf Course Regulations – 2025

The Leisure World Board of Directors has approved the following regulations regarding the use of the golf course.

1. PAYMENT OF FEES

- a. A schedule of prescribed fees for play on the golf course and for the registration and use of power golf carts will be published within the community and posted in the Pro Shop. The schedule, along with its notes, will be considered part of these regulations. Annual fees are payable beginning January 1 and run through December 31.
- b. No person may play on the course before paying the required daily greens fee or annual greens fee. No person may use a power cart for golf unless it has been provided by the Golf Professional or it bears a current registration tag. (See also Section 4 on Golf Carts.)
- c. A person on the golf course shall, at the request of the Golf Professional or staff, present or display a Power Cart tag, or receipt for green fee or cart rental.
- d. A player who violates the provisions of this Section will be required to pay the 18-hole greens fee or the 18hole cart fee, or both for the day on which the violation occurred, in addition to being subject to disciplinary action under these regulations.
- e. Private power carts used for golf must be registered at the Pro Shop. Private power cart owners must be covered by liability insurance.

2. REGISTERING AND STARTING PLAY

- a. No person may start play without first registering at the Golf Shop.
- b. Except as provided below or in the special rules for competition, all players shall start play at the 1st tee.
- c. A player may not start play at the 10th tee without authorization by the Golf Professional or staff.
- d. The Golf Professional or a member of his staff is responsible for setting starting times as required, and shall have the authority to require players to consolidate in foursomes or other groups whenever play warrants such consolidation.
- e. Scheduled events and tournaments require intended players to sign up. Signup sheets are posted in the Pro Shop. Players for most Men's and MISGA Tournaments/ Events use Sign Up On Line (Signup: Online) (http://lwgc.misga-signup.org). Whichever method of signup is used, the Pro Shop must know the participants for each event or tournament.
- f. All non-Golf Club events requiring a shotgun start must be scheduled with and be approved by the Golf Professional.
- g. Persons wishing to schedule Special Golfing Events involving resident family/resident organizations/ outside groups should contact the Golf Professional for information and scheduling.

3. CONDUCT AND ATTIRE

- a. Any person using the golf course shall respect the rights and property of other players, avoid any actions contrary to the welfare of the golf program of the community, comply with directions posted on the golf course, and observe the etiquette of golf and adhere to the standards of conduct set forth herein. All players should recognize they may be held responsible for any personal injury or property damage they may cause while on the course.
- b. A player who causes any injury to persons or any damage to property on or adjacent to the golf course shall promptly report any such incident to either the property owner, the Golf Professional, the Chairman of the Golf and Greens Committee, or the Security office.
- c. Appropriate attire must be worn by all persons using the Leisure World Golf facilities (course and practice area). Attire such as, but not limited to, bathing trunks, short shorts, tank tops and underwear tee shirts with humorous or commercial messages, cut offs, bib coveralls, and jeans are not permitted. The Golf Professional has final authority and will determine if attire is appropriate.
- d. All footwear worn on the golf course must be flat bottomed or designed and intended for golf course use. Metal spikes are prohibited. The Golf Professional has final authority to ban any shoe on an individual basis that, in their judgment, may cause turf damage.
- e. A person shall not play a shot until all persons ahead are out of range.
- f. Players shall be especially careful to avoid endangering the safety of employees. No one shall play a shot within range of an employee until the player has given a warning and is sure that the employee is aware of being in range.

- g. Each player shall be responsible for repairing or filling fairway divots, filling divots on tee boxes with divot mix, fixing ball marks on the green, and smoothing out the sand after playing a shot from a bunker.
- h. Practice shots shall be contained to designated practice areas and shall not be played on any part of the course or any adjacent Trust Property. Practice swings shall not be taken into the turf of a tee area.
- i. All practice balls used on the driving range must be purchased from the Pro Shop. No personal 'shag' bags are allowed on the driving range. No person may use the driving range unless payment is made to the Pro Shop for range balls. Driving range balls are not allowed for play on the golf course.
- j. When the use of temporary greens and tees is in effect, regular greens and tees shall not be used.
- k. Red stakes that have a green tip mean the area is a wildlife sanctuary and or an environmentally sensitive area. Golfers may not retrieve their ball from these areas. It is a penalty area.

4. GOLF CARTS AND EQUIPMENT

- a. Privately owned registered power carts may be used only by the owner or a member of the owner's household and may not be lent to other players.
- b. Privately owned carts must be insured against liability and/or damage.
- c. Residents or guests playing with the private cart owner may ride without paying a cart fee. However, non-cart owners playing in Leisure World Golf Club-sanctioned or MISGA events riding with private cart owners are required to pay the appropriate 9- or 18-hole cart fee.

- d. Cart rules will be posted daily in the Pro Shop and on the 1st and 10th tees. All power carts shall be operated in accordance with directional signs and instructions on the course. All power and pull carts must be at least 30 feet from greens, bunkers, and tee areas. Carts must not pass between a green and adjacent bunker.
- e. Pull carts, golf bags, and golf club carriers shall not be placed on a green, its collar, or its apron.
- f. Carts shall not be driven off the cart paths on holes 7, 8, and 16. Carts should not be parked on the path behind the 9th green. This path is primarily a pedestrian path and should not be blocked by carts playing the 9th hole.
- g. No more than two golf bags will be permitted on a golf cart.
- h. Each player must have at least five clubs and a golf bag or carrier.

5. GUESTS (NON-RESIDENTS)

- a. Residents unable to accompany their guest to the Pro Shop must make arrangements with the Golf Professional.
- b. A guest sixteen (16) years of age or less must be accompanied by a resident and may be admitted to the course only if the Golf Professional or his staff is satisfied that the guest is qualified to play. No one under the age of sixteen (16) will be permitted to drive a rented golf cart.
- c. Guests must observe traffic, crosswalk, and gate entry rules and regulations of the community. The resident is responsible for the conduct of the guest and compliance with the attire as specified in these regulations.

6. PACE AND PRIORITY OF PLAY

a. To promote the general enjoyment of the game, players shall avoid unnecessary delays and maintain a good, alert pace around the course.

- b. A group that does not hold its place on the course must invite the following group to play through if there is a clear hole ahead. Once a group has properly started to play through, it shall be permitted to complete its advance and move out of range.
- c. The Golf Course has no lightning warning system.

 Players must assess the conditions and act accordingly.

7.THE RULES OF GOLF OF THE UNITED STATES GOLF ASSOCIATION (USGA) WILL GOVERN PLAY. LOCAL RULES WILL MODIFY PLAY WHEN CONDITIONS WARRANT.

a. Local rules start on page 14 of this Golf Calendar and are posted in the golf Lounge. In addition, they are published for events and tournaments. They are available online for Leisure World residents only at (residents.lwmc.com/Documents/Golf Information/Golf Course Rules).

8. DISCIPLINARY ACTION

- a. Upon receipt of a signed written complaint, the Golf & Greens Committee may recommend that the General Manager take disciplinary action against any person violating these regulations. Such actions may include censure or suspension of playing privileges for a specified period of time.
- b. A person subject to a disciplinary action may appeal to the Leisure World of Maryland Board of Directors in writing within 10 calendar days of the decision. The Board will consider such an appeal and make its decision in writing.
- c. The Board may inform the community of decisions under this Section by publication in community newspapers, bulletins, or by posting notices on community property.

Regulations on Access to the Golf Course

- The Leisure World of Maryland Board of Directors issues these regulations because unauthorized activities on the golf course may cause serious personal injury or substantial damage to community property. Persons on the Golf Course are there at their own risk.
- 2. These regulations are not intended to interfere with the performance of duties on the golf course by an employee or a contractor. They do not restrict non-golfer use of the asphalt path east of Clubhouse I that runs from Gleneagles Drive to the golf parking lot. They also do not prevent non-golfer use of a 20-foot strip along Gleneagles Drive for walking a pet on a leash.
- 3. Except as specified in these regulations, a person may enter the golf course only:
 - a. to play in accordance with the Golf Course regulations
 - b. to be spectator of a golf match when invited by the players or a sponsor
 - c. to participate in a volunteer improvement project approved by the Golf & Greens Committee and the Golf Professional.

NOTE: The only entrances to, and departures from, the golf course are through the cart path east of Clubhouse I by way of Gleneagles Drive or the golf parking lot. Carts entering from North Leisure World Boulevard must use the golf cart crossing in the median strip.

- 4. Generally, the golf course is restricted to golf activity and walkers are cautioned to be alert to golf activity whenever they are on the Golf Course. The hours for walking are before 8:00 a.m. and after 6:30 p.m. daily.
- 5. Walkers are asked to keep the following guidelines in mind when walking the golf cart paths:
 - Golf cart paths are for pedestrians only. For everyone's safety, bicycles, skateboards, scooters and the like are not allowed.
 - Stay on the golf cart paths. Walking, running, playing, etc. on the greens and fairways can damage the turf and incur costly repairs.
 - Do not approach or interfere with any wildlife or their dwellings.
 - Golf vehicles have the right-of-way on the paths. If necessary, step off the paths until the vehicle passes.
 - Residents use the golf course for golfing/walking at their own risk. Be careful of uneven surfaces on the golf cart paths.
 - Common sense should be used after 6:30 p.m.
 October through March when daylight hours are diminished.

LOCAL RULES FOR LEISURE WORLD GOLF CLUB

"Any Game is more enjoyable when played within the rules!"
The rules of Golf of the United States Golf Association (USGA) Will Govern Play.
Local Rules will modify play when conditions warrant.

- 1. PLAY THE BALL AS IT LIES. Preferred Lies (Winter Rules) are only in effect under poor conditions or off season during Winter Play.
- 2. Free relief is granted for an embedded ball in the general area except in sand.
- 3. All WATER HAZARDS AND DRAINAGE DITCHES AND CERTAIN OTHER AREAS are marked as RED PENALTY AREAS AND DEFINED BY RED LINES AND/OR STAKES. On holes #7 and #16 ANY BALL IN RED PENALTY AREA MAY USE DROP AREA. Carts must stay on cart paths.
- 4. Holes #3, #7, #8 & #16, CARTS MUST STAY ON PATH. There is no fairway on these holes, play as rough from tee to green.
- 5. OUT OF BOUNDS is marked with WHITE STAKES and can be found on holes #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #7, #9, #14, #15, & #17. If no stakes are in place, ROAD defines OUT OF BOUNDS on holes #1, #3, #16 & #18.
- On #17, Rock bed just off tee near cart path is an obstruction and free relief is allowed.
- 7. Hole #11 is a blind driving hole. Players shall not tee off until the group ahead has rung the "All Clear Bell" or that it is verified that the hole is open. All Groups should ring the bell on #11 when all players in your group have advanced out of range.
- 8. All birdhouses are protected. Golf shots that may strike a birdhouse may take line of sight relief.
- 9. Alternative to Stroke and Distance for Lost Ball or Ball Out of Bounds: he use of this local rule is applicable for general and casual play except when it is announced that it cannot be used for certain competitive tournaments. his rule can be used for all holes. It cannot be used when a provisional ball has been played and the provisional ball is not lost and remains in play, or when the ball is in the out of bounds areas behind #1 or

#3, or in a penalty area. When a player's ball has not been found or is known or virtually certain to be out of bounds, the player may proceed as follows rather than proceeding under stroke and distance:

For two penalty strokes, the player may take relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in this relief area (see Rule 14.3):

Two Estimated Reference Points:

- **a. Ball Reference Point:** The point where the original ball is estimated to have:
 - Come to rest on the course, or:
 - Last crossed the edge of the course boundary to go out of bounds.
- b. Fairway Reference Point: The point of fairway of the hole being played that is nearest to the ball reference point, but is not nearer the hole than the ball reference point. For purposes of this Local Rule, "fairway" means any area of grass in the general area that is cut to fairway height or less.

If a ball is estimated to be lost on the course or last crossed the edge of the course boundary short of the fairway, the fairway reference point may be a grass path or a teeing ground for the hole being played cut to fairway height or less.

Size of Relief Area Based on Reference Points

Anywhere between:

- A line from the hole through the ball reference point (and within two club-lengths to the outside of that line), and:
- A line from the hole through the fairway reference point (and within two club-lengths to the outside of that line).
- But with these limits, *Limits on Location of Relief Area:*
 - ▶ Must be in the general area, and:
 - ▶ Must not be nearer the hole than the ball reference point.



Schedule of Reserved Times

Golf players desiring to play outside League and MISGA reserved times must call the Pro Shop for tee times. No walk-ups are permitted. You may reserve a tee time two days in advance. April through October, the Golf Club Leagues and MISGA have priority on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday mornings as follows:

Tuesday: Ladies 9-Hole League

8:00 – 10:30 a.m.; (when a specific event is scheduled). Ladies 9-Hole League players must sign up in the Pro Shop in advance. No walk-ups are permitted.

Wednesday: Men's League and MISGA

8:00 – 11:00 a.m.; (when a specific event is scheduled). Sign up online http://lwgc.misga-signup.org/. For events and Tournaments where Sign Up in the Pro Shop is required, you must call the Pro Shop to sign up. You may call 5-7 days in advance depending on the event. No walk-ups are permitted.

Thursday: Ladies 18-Hole League and MISGA

9:00 – 10:00 a.m.; (when a specific event is scheduled). Ladies 18-Hole League players must sign up in the Pro Shop in advance. No walk-ups are permitted. (See Wednesday for MISGA signup instructions.)

This calendar also lists the dates for PAR3s sponsored by the Golf Course Professional. These are social events open to all residents of Leisure World. All residents participating in PAR3s must pay the cost for prizes and food. Players who have not paid annual greens fees must also pay the daily fees for golf play and cart use. Signup is required.
